The Natchitoches Parish Council met in regular and legal session in the Large Courtroom, on Monday, August 16, 2021 for a Regular of Natchitoches Parish Council meeting at five (5:30) o'clock p.m. for the Natchitoches Parish Council Meeting.

The Parish of Natchitoches was then convened as the governing authority by Chairman Chris Paige who stated that the Parish was ready for the transaction of business.

The invocation was given by Councilman Marty Cheatwood, and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Councilwoman Patsy Hoover.

After the roll call there were present Council: Chris Paige, Patsy Hoover, James Kilcoyne, Marty Cheatwood, and John Salter.

Chairman Paige stated the next agenda item will be Invited guests and special presentations. None

Chairman, Paige stated the next agenda item we will hear the report of the Public Works Director, Mr. Johnny Salard, "Thank you this evening, you all have my report, in July we completed Phase One Emmanuel Road Project, we completed a number of base failures in different roads we completed ditching projects Phase One on Maricelli Road and another number of countless roads that we have fixed and repaired. Any questions at this time?"

Chairman Paige, asked "Is that's the end of your report?" Mr. Salard, replied, "Yes." Chairman Paige, replied, "Thank you so much, anybody have any question for him."

Chairman, Paige, then recognizes Ms. Sharon Harris, OCS Executive Director, Ms. Harris, "Good afternoon to everyone, you received my report for the month of July. Do you have any questions in reference to the written report? I have one additional thing to give to you all if you look under the low-income energy assistance program item C. You can see we are going to get some American Rescue Plan Act money in the amount of \$515,000 thousand dollars and I will be keeping you posted on that and send correspondence on how we going to be able to spend the funds."

Chairman Paige, replied, "Thank you so much Ms. Harris."

Chairman, Paige, then recognizes Parish Treasurer Julie Lockhart "Good evening, you have my report for the month of July which includes the check registry and the posted transactions. So, if anyone have any questions, I'll take them now."

Chairman, Paige then recognizes Interim Director of Planning and Zoning Mr. David Kees, Jr. "Thank you Chairman Paige. I sent out my report earlier this week. I will entertain any questions on it."

Chairman Paige, asked, "Are there anything else added?" Mr. Kees, replied, "No, Sir, not at this time."

Chairman, Paige then recognizes Parish President.

John Richmond, "Thank you Mr. Chairman, and good evening to everyone, I would like to remind everyone of a couple of things, number one face masks is required once again to enter into the Courthouse and other Natchitoches Parish Government Facilities, social distancing, frequent hand washing and sanitizing are also recommended and like to make sure everyone understands that in short order probably around Wednesday of this week the Live Oak building has finished it's painting but the Health Unit is getting a new roof, I bring that up because a number of our constituents use the Health Unit and goes in there on a regular of basis, I just want to make sure they understand that we are opened, we will just be re-roofing and safety will be the highest priority so we may have some things roped off and maybe re-directed to another entranced but all of that will be clearly designated by Personnel. One other thing that is a primary importance is the Solid Waste we thought we may have a deal on a piece of property to lease out in the Kisatchie area we are still working on that but if anyone has any options or offers with regards to property for a new bin site in the Kisatchie area we will entertain all of those options once again that is a dire need we need some help there and if anyone has any property that they would allow us to lease. Also, on the agenda tonight this will be the final thing that I will mention will be an item concerning Cedar Bend and Riverview Road and I ask your consideration on that tonight and its good to have the Council together if it is virtual/on the phone, but I appreciate you still conducting the business of the Parish. End of my report, Mr. Chairman."

- A. Council to consider authorizing the Parish President to enter into Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Cedar Bend Community and Gerry Unruh for improvements to Cedar Bend Drive and Riverview Drive.

Ms. Roy asked, "Can Mr. Richmond explain this just a little bit is that a Good Samaritan Project?"

Parish President responded, "Ms. Roy, this was brought to us by a group of residents that lives in the Cedar Bend and Riverview area and several of them are getting together, and they are going to put down a layer of cold mix asphalt on top of 2500 feet of road. The length of the road is about 2500 feet long and it's a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement because we will be going out there what we call shave the shoulders so the water can drain off the road prior to them installing this material we will also be trucking the material they will be purchasing it, but we will be trucking it prior to that site, and this is

Cooperative Endeavor Agreement this not a good Samaritan agreement its just a general Cooperative Endeavor that we are working together with some people on the roads. It is not the whole length of the road; they want to try this to see if this experiment works well for them and if it does, they may consider doing more of the road later."

Ms. Roy, replied, "Great, Thank you."

On motion by Councilwoman Patsy Hoover, duly seconded by, Councilman John Salter that the Natchitoches Parish Council, in regular and legal session, does authorize the Parish President to enter into Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Cedar Bend Community and Gerry Unruh for improvements to Cedar Bend Drive and Riverview Drive.

B. Council to consider authorizing the Parish President, to award the RFQ and sign a contract with IBTS being the lowest bidder that related to Certified Building Official and Flood Plan management services.

Councilman Cheatwood, asked, "Mr. Chairman, I would like to see if we have any representatives online from IBTS and any other people that had bided on this to hear from them."

Chairman Paige, replied, "There are some of them on there and we will give them an opportunity to hear them speak, Mr. Marty. We had talked about having a special meeting, but the District Attorney had replied from some of the comments that we related to calling the Special Meeting we got that Friday afternoon, actually, but I will be quite and let the others speak. There was several comments and things that had been made about the 3 different companies that is involved in this process and some are not located in Natchitoches Parish we wanted to make sure that we didn't do anything wrong and we didn't want to give the appearance of doing anything wrong, if we send it back out to bids, so, I'll be quite and let the others Mr. Balac, and Mr. Matthew is on and I'm quite sure someone else may be on."

Mr. Matthew Johns and Mr. Kenny Andrews with the Rapides Area Planning Commission if you don't mind, we will jump in a give you a brief presentation and step out the way for IBTS to speak to you as well, is that Okay?" Mr. Johns, continues, "We are very excited about the opportunity to be able to serve your constituents some of things that have been asked repeatedly in the last couple of months and I will hit on them, We will have someone on the grounds in Natchitoches Parish every day, we will assist in every part of the process from permitting, Plan Reviews, Inspections, Certificate of Occupancy and certified Floodplain Management, we feel like some of the things that

makes us pretty much suited is that we are in the proximity that is fairly close we are not in Natchitoches Parish, but we are right down the road. We do cover 6 Parishes in Central Louisiana right under you guys we handle emergency situations a little bit differently, which has been really important over the last several years with hurricanes, floods, and freezes or snow that we have had recently some things that we do for damage determination is that we charge a small fee all along the way for development reviews, and doing floodplain determination to help us offset any potential cost whenever there is an emergency we feel that whenever folks are having to rebuild their lives after a natural disaster it's kind of wrong for us to try and kick them while they are down and try to charge them a pretty large fee to try to get their permit and try to get back on their feet. The following main storms and natural disasters the Government Declarations or Presidential Declaration of Disasters we waive fees during that where we will be charging just a little bit all along the way we found that to be really that to be really preferential that the folks that we serve in Louisiana we can do 24 hours turn around that typically requires a one day notice there are times when we can handle an emergency situation that we can get up there fast enough to handle something if there needs to be a concrete poured prior to a rain or incumbent weather and we also have a track record in making sure that the Parishes we serve are having some equable revenue from the process we are not trying to make money for you guys from the back of your constituents, but there are jobs that you are doing that you can charge a fair fee for, for instance the first we used in Avoyelles Parish we generated through permit fees around a hundred to a hundred thirty some thousands a year and the Parish themselves outside of what we charged for our fee of doing the building reviews generated up to \$130,000 to \$150,000 Thousand for themselves. I know generating revenue trying to offset some of the cost that you have for doing your local reviews and local work, we know that is important to the Parish we will work with you every step of the way to make sure that is taken care of. We offer software that is no charge to you guys every member that wants it can have access to it on the second reporting and we are available every hour of the day each of you guys have my cell phone already and you call that or the Building Official that will be assigned to your area. Currently we have 6 Building Officials and 3 permit techs and 2 certified Floodplain Managers that will be ample to cover you guys; however, we do intend to if we are awarded the contract to do a one to two month assessment of the amount of activity and if necessary we hire another building official with your assistance, we will ask any of you guys to participate of the interview committee so if we elect someone new you can have an input of who that would be serving Natchitoches Parish and that would be the boots on the ground every single day. If you so choose to go with us, we are prepared to be there tomorrow morning if necessary and we are looking forward to the opportunity and I'll be happy to answer any questions."

Chairman Paige, replied, "Thank you so much Mr. Matt. Do anyone has anything else, IBTS or the other person on the line?"

Mr. Joseph Balac, replied, "I am assuming that Larry Walters is going to speak for us, however, when I was invited to join today, we weren't aware that an oral presentation was involved, I am not sure how prepared Larry is to give a similar presentation, but I'll let Larry speak to our capabilities and what we have done for the Parish over the years.

Mr. Larry Walters, responded, "I wasn't prepared to give any type of presentation, I didn't know that was going to be done tonight, but I think that everything that Matt said we offer the exactly the same services they do and at better price, I think for the Parish and we also going to be there every day and I'm also available on the phone 7 days a week, we will have people there every day and we want to continue to service the Parish, I think our track record has been very good since 2018 when we started providing services there and as far as I know the Parish President has been very pleased with our services, we work very closely with him and we will continue to be able to do those things for you and if you have any questions we will answer those questions and I have Joseph here from our Corporate Office, Our legal Counsel and he is also willing to answer any questions. I think we will provide better, and we are also offering to rebate money back to you. We will love to have your business and to continue to work with you as we have over the last several years."

Chairman Paige, replied, "Just to make clear the situation, no one was asked to prepare a statement, I think Mr. Matt Johns just presented his business and made his comments in a way to present himself, but the bottom line of it is anyone can say whatever they want to say, we are just trying to get some closure to this and make sure we move forward one way or the other, right now, Mr. Kees, how long is the agreement that we have in place, I think it's about to terminate, isn't it?"

Mr. Kees, replied, "Yes, Sir, at the June meeting we extended the agreement, the Council agreed to extend the agreement for 60 days at the conclusion of the previous agreement so that will get us to the end of August."

Chairman Paige, replied, "Ok, what ever we need to do to move this process along, lets do so right now, we need to get a motion, would someone like to make a motion or not, its, B that we are discussing. Is there a motion, or at the next month meeting we must take action?" Councilman Kilcoyne, replied, "Mr. Chairman, I will make a motion, so, maybe we can get a vote tonight." Chairman Paige, replied, "Yes, we don't have to next month we need to do it this month, I am I correct or not?" Councilman Kilcoyne and Mr. Kees, both replied, "Yes, you are correct." Councilman Kilcoyne, replied, "Based on the information that I have been able to beam, reading out of this, is that IBTS is the low bidder and me not having any other information to separates the two Companies, I am sure both of them will do a quality job, I have no reasons to think otherwise, specific based on the low bid, I make a motion that we authorize the Parish President to award the RFQ to the lowest bidder IBTS." Chairman Paige, asked, "How long is the contract?"

Mr. Kees, replied, "We was going to go 3 years."

On motion by Councilman Jim Kilcoyne Died for a Second.

Chairman Paige, replied, "At this point we don't want to delay any of the services; so, we going to have to take some type of action. Mr. Mansour, how would that go about? we don't want to see any delays with the providing of services to the residents of Natchitoches Parish."

Parish Attorney, Mr. Mansour, replied, "Mr. Chairman, according to the information from Mr. Kees the contract with IBTS continues to the end of this month, so, if the Council wants to consider other vendors, then they, the Council, would either call a special meeting to address that or seek someone to take over the services if IBTS refuses to continue providing the service after the end of August."

Councilwoman Hoover, wanted to ask a question, "Mr. Johnson, at this time the Parish Attorney replied, "Mr. Johns." Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "Mr. Johnson, is that his name?" Chairman replied, "Matt Johns." Councilwoman Hoover, continues, "We are talking about the end of August is that correct from our Attorney? August will end the contract?" Parish Attorney, replied, "That is the information that Mr. Kees, provided me."

Chairman Paige, replied, "60 days will be up at the end of August, I believe." Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "Okay, so that means we will have to have a special meeting?" Parish Attorney, replied, "Or to amend the agenda, you can amend the agenda tonight if by a unanimous vote." Chairman Paige, replied, "Well, what we have on the agenda tonight, I don't know if we are ready to present something tonight for any other services, at some point of another we need to reject all bids from the beginning of the process, and what we got from you Mr. Mansour, we haven't went into that discussion, but right now is what we are dealing with it that this matter it has died for a lack of second and we can move on and we have to take this up before the deadline." Parish Attorney, replied, "Yes, Sir."

Councilwoman Hoover, asked, "I want ask if it is possible that if we added it to the agenda that we can place each company names and we vote on each one of those companies?" Parish Attorney replied, "If you have unanimous vote to amend the agenda." Chairman Paige, replied, "Yes, you can do that, but all you would have been one person to object to it, and I think we have time to have another special meeting, since we are doing it by phone anyway, before this thing is due." Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "If we want to resolve it tonight each Council member would agree to amend the agenda then we will be able to actually go on and vote on it tonight, if each Council members agree to amend the agenda." Parish Attorney, replied, "Then make a motion to amend the agenda." Councilwoman Hoover, replied, I make a motion to amend the agenda that each business would be allowed to be allowed to be voted on." Parish Attorney, replied, "So for clarification, Ms. Hoover, are you asking to amend to add three agenda items on each item, to allow the Council to address each of the applicants separately?" Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "Yes, that each applicant will be voted on, rather its RAPC or IBTS and what's the other one? Council Clerk, replied, "SG" Chairman Paige, asked, "Will it needs to be a contract that

we need to look at and go over before we decide?" Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "You already have the contracts." Chairman Paige, replied, "The contracts from who?" Councilwoman Hoover, replied, "All of them."

Councilman Salter, replied, "I'm telling everybody, I am not going to vote to amend the agenda, because we need to move on, because this motion has died for a lack of second."

Chairman Paige, replied, "Yes, let's move on, we have to do what is needed at a later time."

Thank you."

12. Visitors for Non-Agenda Items. (3 minutes)

Representative Rodney Schamerhorn, District 24, begins, "Good afternoon, I planned on coming to the meeting today, this will work just a good, I guess, we have a long way to go to get back to where we were, the mask, I just denied a meeting in New Orleans because they were going to require a mask mandate, they were going to require that we prove that we were vaccinated or we haven't tested negative in the last 72 hours, guys I feel that is an infringement on our rights, I believe if you have

health problems you need to take care of yourself, but and that is my opinion only, but having a daughter with cystic fibrosis her and her husband have really had to create their own lives around being safe, because that is a pulmonary disease, cystic fibrosis is, it would be detrimental to her, but I do want to reiterate that I am here for yawl anytime you need anything or any assistance please get with me and I hope that that the weather has dried up a little bit, that some of the ditching and road work can get done and get ready for winter time. I received a whole lot of calls in my District for the roads being deplorable and I appreciate some attention on them, but if you have any questions, you can call me or ask me right now."

Ms. Carolyn Roy, asked, "Do you pro-see any money for roads from the State Legislature for Natchitoches Parish? Representative Schamerhorn replied, "Ma'am they are for the State Roads, not the Parish roads." Ms. Roy, stated, "So, you don't see any money for Natchitoches Parish?" Representative Schamerhorn, replied, "No ma'am, I really don't the Federal Government has shipped all type of monies to these different Parishes and it's up to them to man your monies and if you are running shy of road material maybe you can spend some of that on the roads and ditches, stuff like that, but me and the President, Richmond has spoke earlier in Baton Rouge, he had come to Baton Rouge, It's my understanding that we were going to put some ditching contracts out with some of the money, but I haven't gotten back with John and I don't think any of that has materialize as yet, but hopefully we can see some ditching since it's dried up."

Ms. Carolyn Roy, replied, "Thank you."

Parish President, replied, "Mr. Schamerhorn, this is John Richmond, Chairman, may I speak?" Chairman, replied, "Go Ahead." Parish President, continues, "Let me give you a little clarity there, as you read the American Rescue Plan ditching in itself, they are not allowing in this first go around they do say that storm waters drainage will be allowed and we have asked for some clarity because, we have a lot of ditching that we would like to do. They have specifically said that was not allowed. Now there are some things that we can do. For example, if we have some waterlines that are running shallow in some ditches if we need to rework those waterlines which we can do under the American Rescue Plan Act then that allows us to work those ditches, its going to be a case by case its not a Parish wide thing, it will be something that we will be meeting with all of our Water Systems in this Parish on Thursday evening at 6:00 o'clock here in the Courthouse, here in the Large Courtroom and if we have an overflow crowd we will have two meetings, but the idea we want to make sure that we spend this money correctly, because if we don't as you know we will have to pay it back."

Representative Schamerhorn, replied, "Like I said, I just canceled my meeting in New Orleans for Thursday night and Friday, I probably will try to do my best to be there. It's going to be at 6:00 or 5:00?" Parish President, replied, "6:00 so everybody can get home from work and be up here at the Courthouse." Representative Schamerhorn, replied, "Okay, that would be good. Yes, anything we can do to do to start working on these, I did hear if waterlines were shallow on the road or

ditches we could go through there and spend that money on removing or setting the waterlines on the back slope, making them deeper, dig the ditch out and if the road is destroyed or messed up in anyway then we can go ahead and fix the road, from my understanding. Hopefully we can get some of those done, I know waterlines are everywhere and they are a problem, I know every Parish having problems with the waterlines."

Chairman Paige, stated, "And we certainly don't want the money to go back to the Federal Government, we need to do every aspect as we possible can by getting all the municipalities and the townships making sure that we have done all that we could to make sure we clarify and spend the money to the best of our ability."

Representative Schamerhorn, replied, "Thank you Mr. Paige."

Councilwoman Hoover, stated, "Mr. Rodney, it is mandatory that we wear a mask also at the 6:00 meeting." Representative Schamerhorn, replied, "I don't have a problem with wearing a mask in meetings that is required, I don't think that I have to prove that I was vaccinated or tested negative before the meeting, that was my main problem, with New Orleans."

Chairman Paige, replied, "I can certainly tell you as a Health Care worker that this Delta variant has really picked up. With Emergencies around the State, people are dying at a high rate, and I can certainly tell you that there is a lot of people that can't take the vaccine, but due to problems they may have with medical issues, that those that can take it, we really need to get those people vaccinated as we possibly can. This is never going to go away; it's looking very sketchy. I hope and pray that our Schools stay opened they are just starting, and I can tell you it doesn't look good."

Council Clerk wanted to go on record that she didn't receive any emails with any questions concerning this evening's meeting, the deadline was 12:00 noon today, and she didn't receive any emails.

Chairman Paige, responded, "Also, Ms. Sheryl will be starting a vacation, Friday, and if you have any questions, I think we got an email to that effect."

Chairman Paige, stated the next agenda item:




